Today, I join with you my fellow citizens and the international community as we commemorate the observance of World AIDS Day 2017 under this year's UNAIDS theme: "My Health, My Right". The aim is to focus on the right to health and explores the challenges people around the world face in exercising their rights.

Managing HIV and AIDS in and through the workplace not only protect the rights of workers to manage their health and their livelihoods but can improve productivity at both the enterprise and national levels. The Ministry of Labour and Small Enterprise Development is doing its best to contribute to several important international targets including UNAIDS' new 90-90-90 targets which are that by the year 2020:

- 90% of all people living with HIV will know their HIV status.
- 90% of all people with diagnosed HIV infection will receive sustained antiretroviral therapy.
- 90% of all people receiving antiretroviral therapy will have viral suppression.

The Ministry of Labour and Small Enterprise Development is committed to doing its part and is putting workers, employers and national productivity on the forefront of its agenda for the realization of Decent Work for all. Through collaboration and dedicated effort it will be possible to mitigate the impact of HIV on our workforce.

The Ministry joins in global solidarity as we take this time to remember the ones we have lost to the disease and equally focus our attention to the plights of those infected and affected by HIV and AIDS. We reflect on the significant strides that have been made and look forward with a renewed level of vigor towards a heightened national response to HIV and AIDS.
